

Spring came while we were asleep this year. I'm fairly certain of it. We went to bed with barren branches and woke up to generous green buds sprouting from every limb. Did you notice how dandelions now pepper our lawns? Or how the frogs are calling to each other again? How the loons resumed their floating parades? Or how the songbirds revived their tunes? It's pretty awe-inspiring to notice these seasonal developments.

Some of us notice these changes sooner than others. They've developed a practice of listening. Not listening in the sense of "I heard that," but in the sense that they are attuned to the world around them. For them, listening is an active verb. They are being attentive to noticing how God is present in the world around them.

It takes some practice to be able to listen in a way that becomes second nature. We aren't born with this skill, we have to develop it. Listening doesn't come without effort. Sometimes, even with our best intentions, we find listening hard. Our thoughts and concerns can be really loud...long after our heads have hit the pillow, we may find ourselves having trouble quieting those voices. Or maybe the demands the day has placed upon us have drowned out the quiet voice of God.

Listening isn't accidental, it's intentional. Maybe you've told yourself you'll stop and slow down this summer...that you'll relax and listen then. I know


I've told myself that little lie, more than once. But I don't really stop to listen until after an injury, or an illness, or some big life event has sidelined me and forced me to be still. And in that stillness, my first response is anger, frustration, or disappointment because I didn't make the choice to be still. Once I've gotten over myself, I'm ready to receive the invitation to listen, to contemplate.

Father Richard Rohr says contemplation is "wordless resting in the presence of God beyond all thoughts and images. Not thinking, just resting." When we listen with contemplation, somehow we emerge with a new and deeper understanding of the world. God reveals things to us that aren't accessible outside of communing in this way. We need this time just as much as we need air, water, and food. Resting in the oneness of God is vital to our lives. It makes it possible for us to listen to and live within the voice of God.

Summer will be full of opportunities...opportunities that call us into celebration for a graduate or a family milestone, opportunities to gather with friends and play, and opportunities to retreat and rest. Seize those moments. They're important. And save some space for listening too. CTK is beginning to stir after a time of hibernation, and things are beginning to wake. Old things are returning and new things are being considered. How might listening be helpful in the next leg of our journey? What might God be leading us towards? May you find joy in the contemplation as you seek to listen to the voice of God in the days to come!

# TRY A PRAYER JOURNAL THIS SUMMER

ELCA Bishop Michael Rinehart says that "prayer is the foundation of our spiritual life." He also often quotes Mother Theresa, who said: "The fruit of silence is prayer. The fruit of prayer is faith. The fruit of faith is love. The fruit of love is service. The fruit of service is peace."

I am a firm believer in prayer and enjoy encouraging others to pray. Not long after I joined CTK, we studied Bishop Mike's 40-day devotional, *Learning to Pray Agai*n, during Lent. But it's a work I return to often, again and again.

With the busy-ness of summer upon us, I was thinking of a way to stay focused on the foundation of prayer. Recently, while enjoying Bishop Mike's blog at https://bishopmike.com/pray/ I came across a prayer journal created by ELCA Pastor Tammy Sharp of Christus Victor in Houston that's tied to *Learning to Pray Again*, although Bishop Mike says that you don't need his book to use Pastor Tammy's *Prayer Journal*, which is downloadable for free from the above website. I like the simplicity of her journal, which includes the following preface/introduction by Pastor Tammy, adapted from Bishop Mike's introduction, which I can share by permission:

Everybody prays. If you've ever hoped that a date would say yes, that you would get a good grade on the paper, get the job offer, dodge a diagnosis, then you have prayed. The yearning of the heart is prayer.

If you have ever stood at a mountaintop, overwhelmed by the beauty, or at the ocean, struck by its majesty, or laid in your back yard staring at the stars, millions of miles away, you have prayed.

If you have sat or walked in silence, allowing your spirit to become calm and receptive, if you have listened to your soul, discerning an important decision, or if you have felt a tug within you to do something benevolent, bigger than yourself, then you have prayed. You have experienced what people throughout the ages have called the Holy Spirit. You have communed with God.

Even if you feel far from God right now, God is closer than you think, closer than a brother, closer than your own skin. God is in you and around you, and every breath you take. prayer is multifaceted. There are many different ways to pray. Some of these ways are more conducive to your personality than others. There have been many times in my life that I have been stuck in my prayer life. For one reason or another I felt I couldn't even pray. Most often, it was discovering a new way of praying that helped me break through to a new place of deeper peace, greater awareness and more acute introspection. The small book is a prayer journey. In these 40 chapters we will explore many different ways to pray. If you read these each day, I guarantee you, you will find all kinds of ways to pray. You will not be bored. If you're stuck, you will get unstuck. Try it.

I am embracing Pastor Tammy's invitation and I am going try using her *Prayer Journal* this summer, especially to help me stay focused on the foundation of my spiritual life, prayer. I invite you to consider trying it, too.

#### PRESIDENT'S PONDERINGS

I would be remiss to not mention that a significant number of congregation members (myself included) have had to deal with COVID during May. Two of our congregation members, with underlying health issues ended up being hospitalized which should remind us that while an inconvenience for most, COVID, can be a very serious illness for some.

I attended the annual Synod Assembly May 13-14 with this year's theme being Emerging in Hope. From the opening worship, a commemoration of Remember the Children Initiative and throughout there was a focus on our youth. The title of a presentation from Rev. Dr. Amy Marga, a Professor at Luther Seminary whose research focuses on children in the Christian tradition was "Eight Things You Need to Know About God and Children". Marcus Pope another main presenter is the president of Youthprise, a non-profit organization based in Minneapolis that works to increase learning, leadership and economic opportunities and safety in community for Minnesota's disadvantaged youth.


The synod introduced The Planting Hope Campaign with a goal to raise one million dollars within 3 years to be used on the Families Together project on the East Side of St. Paul. Alexis Oberdorfer, with LSS, joined Bishop Patricia Lull, Amy Marga and Marcus Pope in a conversation about how we care for all of our children. Congregations have been challenged

to help raise funds for the Planting Hope Campaign.


- Stay up to date with vaccines and boosters.

# 'Buy Down The Mortgage' campaign is now underway.

Our goal is to gather \$18,000 by the end of July and make one large principal prepayment in August. This payment will significantly lower our mortgage balance, shorten the term of our mortgage and reduce the amount of interest that we will pay over the life of the loan. The amount of temporarily restricted funds, including memorials, is \$90,002 and are not available to be used for day-to-day operational expenses.

The mortgage balance as of April 30 = \$187,031.


